

# Camden County Young Lawyers Support Larc with Lobsters

**T**he first annual **Young Lawyer Committee Lobster Bake To Benefit Larc School**, held this past September, was a swimming success, with abundant seafood, music... and support for Larc School.

The money-raising event was conceived and held by **The Young Lawyer Committee (YLC) of the Camden County Bar Association** in an effort to contribute more to the Camden County community, said Michael V. Madden, an attorney with **Madden and Madden**, in Haddonfield, and **Trustee of the YLC**.

**Connery; and Rachel Licausi, Esq. and Adam Gersh, Esq. of Flaster Greenberg**, Mr. Madden, worked on the project for a couple of years, and chose Larc as beneficiary of their efforts.

“Once we found Larc School, our goal was to create a scholarship fund to assist in offsetting

increasing costs for educating and caring for its student body,” Mr. Madden said. “We decided a lobster bake would be a great way to have a good time—enjoying good food and drink, and live music—while, at the same time, raise money for such a great cause as Larc School.”

The sold-out, multi-sponsored event hosted 150 people in a tent at **The Tap Room**, in Westmont, and served up traditional lobster bake fare, including lobsters, clams, corn on the cob, shrimp, beer, and wine. After all was said and done, eaten and danced, there was no question about repeating the event the following year—“The next YLC Lobster Bake will take place September 10, 2011,” said Mr. Madden.

Among the distinguished guests were **Linda Eynon, President of the Camden County Bar Association**, who thanked the YLC for its effort and support; a number of Camden County judges; Larc School Board Chairperson Edward McDonnell, Board Treasurer Patricia Egan Jones, and Board Members Reginald Beckett and James Rhodes; Larc School Principal Bethann Rogers, and Larc School Teachers Michele McCloskey and David Sheehan. Other speakers were Mr. Madden, who thanked the YLC and told of his inspiring tour of Larc; and Larc School Executive Director Susan Weiner, who also offered thanks, along with a few words about Larc School and its students.

The YLC raised \$15,000 to seed the scholarship

fund and produce the event. “Our goal is to provide at least \$5,000 a year to Larc,” said Mr. Madden, who presented Larc with this year’s check for \$5,000.

## Message From The Board by Carol Parker-Elbert Vice-Chairperson

**I** am so pleased to have the opportunity to reflect on my long-standing relationship with Larc School, which began as a Special Education teacher in 1977. At that time, the school was renting classroom space from a synagogue on the White Horse Pike, in Haddon Heights. We had limited resources—such as puzzles with missing pieces and a container of broken crayons—and made most of the instructional materials ourselves.

The staff consisted of about five teachers, each having three to five students. Thirty-three years later, I can still tell you the name of each student and where some of them are today. I've continued to be close friends with that early group of teachers, who, long ago, formed a club called The Ladies of Larc. We've all stayed connected to

Larc in one way or another, with one even continuing as a staff member today. I believe this is one of the qualities that makes Larc so unique—sincere commitment and personal connection to the students, families and staff.

Larc's numbers have grown through the years—from one rented classroom to a school with 17 classrooms, a gym, library, sensory room and adaptive playground; from 5 students to 120; and from five teachers to over 100 staff members, including physical, occupational, speech and music therapists, nurses, a psychologist, and an adaptive physical education teacher. What has not changed is Larc's commitment to excellence and individualized attention to ensure that each and every student has the opportunity to reach his or her greatest potential. Teachers and therapists at Larc work tirelessly to encourage students to achieve goals and possibilities set, not only by academic measures, but by personal needs and abilities as well.

Though I traveled on from Larc to become a Learning Disabilities Consultant, I knew I could not ever truly leave Larc. In my capacity as a Board Member, I continue to feel solidly part of

the school and its mission.

So much pride and commitment is associated with my relationship with Larc. I feel proud that, through the years, and with the help of many others, Larc has grown to become a state-of-the-art facility for youngsters and adults with disabilities... a place where each student continues to be personally guided to be the very best they can be. I am committed to continue to work—along with the teachers, therapists, staff, administration and fellow Board Members—to ensure that Larc remains a welcoming, therapeutic, learning environment for countless years to come.

The success of Larc and its students continues to be a great source of gratification and delight for me. As I now examine my long journey with Larc, I find that, although much has changed, my relationship with, and commitment to this extraordinary school has not changed at all, just as Larc's core mission—its commitment to its students and families—has remained constant.

in the library once a week. The Team Board allows students a way to communicate, to learn... and allows teachers a way to teach.

In January of this year, Larc purchased a second Team Board—one that is mobile and height-adjustable, and can be wheeled into individual classrooms.

"Some people think that if you can't speak, you don't have knowledge. At Larc, we know this simply is not true," said Larc School Principal Bethann B. Rogers. "The Team Board, an interactive, touch-screen teaching aid, allows Larc students with cognitive and physical disabilities to show us what they know—even if they don't have the ability to speak or write, they can touch."

Acquired in 2008, the Team Board, a 77-inch, interactive whiteboard shared by all classes, works with a computer and projector, and is mounted on a wall in the library. Each class takes a turn working with the board

"The Team Board has been such a gift to our school. I've seen it motivate and enable our students," said Larc Teacher Rael LaPenta. "This new technology allows the dramatic and exciting presentation of academics. It helps the students practice so many skills, such as handwriting!"

"They love its visual and auditory effects, and find them highly motivating," said Ms. LaPenta. "My students play games on the Team Board to work on patterns, count coins, learn safety rules, and practice phonics. It even allowed them to take a virtual tour of Ellis Island!"

"It's an excellent tool. The students find it very exciting," said Ms. Rogers. "When they're involved in a lesson, you can see the excitement in their faces. They're engaged and anxious to have a turn."

Teachers would love to have one in every classroom, but it's expensive—about \$8,000 a unit. The purchase of equipment such as the Team Board is funded in part by Larc's annual golf tournament and other activities so generously supported by Larc Friends and Families. "Larc is an incredible school," said Ms. Gonzales. "I have no doubt that there are very few as good."

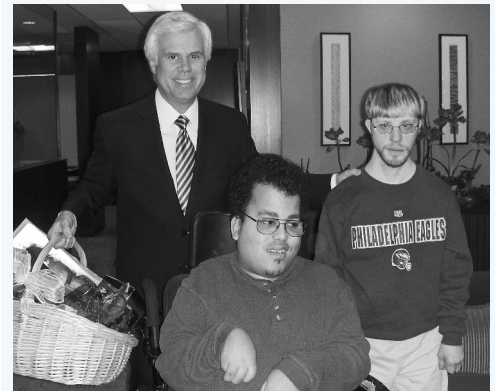
